
The first floor worked perfectly for our 120 guests. That includes the tables we brought in for the catered food and the DJ with his lighted dance floor. The space didn't feel awkward and empty; nor was it a shoulder to shoulder crush. The kids were able to enjoy socializing, with some civilized room to breath.

Unique architectural details make HighDomain more than just a studio box, or an event loft. The kids appreciated the second floor rooms, from which to look down at the action on the studio floor. And on the first floor, the side rooms were very popular for little impromptu gatherings, away from the music, where the kids could chat together.

That the side rooms had glass windows, through which everyone could see one another, I believe contributed to the atmosphere of community. Had the windows not existed, I think the side rooms may have taken on a "VIP"-ish vibe, which teens certainly don't need to be burdened with.
